Easter Time: The World and God's Resurrection Community

In Acts chapter 2 we hear the story of the day of Pentecost, the day the Christian church began. On that day the apostles received a vision from God, with accompanying gifts of communication. Verse 4 says: All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. On that same day the disciples spoke to others about their faith in Jesus in such a way that people from 16 different nations or cultures understood what they were saying. It was a powerful multi-cultural moment for the church.

Today it often seems like we have lost much of that *holy gift of diversity*. Beginning in April we will have a series of worship services focusing on the world as Christ's resurrection community. On April 3rd we will open our series with the theme *Whose World Is It Any Way?* We will then celebrate 5

Sundays with an emphasis on God's working in different nations of the world. Each country we talk about: China,



the Philippines, Korea, Sri Lanka and India has a personal connection to *Our Redeemer's*. We will end our series on May 15th, the Sunday we celebrate Pentecost, the time of the church coming together. Please join us for worship during this Easter season as we hear about God working throughout the world.

Richard Vales is our unofficial missionary in the Philippines. He has been undergoing several health problems in recent months. The following is an excerpt from his latest email.

Here is an up date on my well being. My swelling of my feet and hands is down 10% and that's good. Praise the Lord. And I now can move my hands a little. My diabetes is under control thanks to the Lord. My arthritis is the same as it was before. And the nerves pressing on my spine is the same. So all in all I am getting better. Than you Jesus.

Yesterday we went and got food for 100 families. My wife her sister and me. Because I cannot do much with my hands I was the supervisor. I had all ready figured out what we needed, the brand and the cost. Just to let you know it cost \$497.00 for the food for 100 families. In the next day or 2 we will be packaging it all up. And than 2 days later we will pass it out.

...We buy as many things as we can in bulk and repackage it all. As soon as we pass these bags out I will start working on the next 100.
