#### Micah Ministries Adding Justice to Mercy (With a Good Dose of Humility) by Bruce Bedingfield

Our church has begun a new ministry this year, concentrating on social justice. It is based on Micah 6:8 ("...And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God")

Church members have been meeting this fall to explore ways our congregation can help to promote social justice. So far, we have decided to start by emphasizing hunger as a social justice concern. Hunger would seem to be a natural topic for *Our Redeemer's* as it is already such a high priority among our "caring ministries" (e.g. CROP Walk, Society of St. Andrews, Rogers Park Soup Kitchen, etc) Christ can truly look at *Our Redeemer's* and say, "For I was hungry, and you gave me food."

How, then, do "Justice Ministries" differ from Caring Ministries?

Justice ministries don't compete with, or take the place of our Caring Ministries. They complement them. Caring Ministries say, "You are hungry and we will feed you". That is the essence of Christian service. Justice ministries, on the other hand, say, "You are hungry, and that is not right." Ideally Justice Ministries can approach the roots of hunger. It might involve writing a letter when politicians consider a vote to cut food stamps. It might involve empowering the poor to produce food. It might sometimes involve simply studying a problem, knowing the Holy Spirit may eventually lead us to act. Through it all we don't pretend to have all the answers (that's where the humble fellowship comes in.)

Between now and the end of the year, Micah Ministries will be supporting the church's holiday campaign for the Heifer Project. This is a wonderful example of a hunger ministry that provides families around the world with a source of food, then encourages them to share their animal's offspring with others. They even provide small loans to help the poor start businesses. We urge you all to support the Heifer Project

Micah Ministries is open to the entire congregation. Please consider becoming a part of this social justice ministry as we seek God's direction for our work.

Micah Ministries' next meeting will be Tuesday, January 10 at 7:30 PM.





## Christmas: From Holiday to Holy Day

Christmas is a wonderful time for us as followers of Christ. We remember the coming of hope into the world in the person of a child. This gift of the baby Jesus tells us that God did not withhold anything from us, but gave us his Son, that we might know his love and his redeeming grace. Much of what we try to do at Christmas reminds us of that gift of a child, the hope that was born into the world and the joy that comes with knowing God's amazing love.

Yet it often seems difficult to celebrate this season of God's hope and joy. We just seem to get pre-occupied with the demands and expectations of the season. As your pastor, I would suggest we begin to re-claim Christmas, and resist the flood of cultural expectations and clever marketing associated with this holiday. I admit that is not an easy thing to do. Practices such as gift giving are important in showing love and friendship to others. So what if we started one step at a time, and this year focused on the practice of gift giving.

For the last 3 years we as a church have participated in the Heifer Project. This program takes donations and then buys animals and other things that people can receive so that they can raise their own food. This year in your Christmas budget set aside a percentage of what you plan to spend and commit it to the Heifer Project. For example, set aside 10% - 25% of your Christmas spending and commit it to purchasing a goat, a heifer, chickens, ducks, rabbits or other animals that will help people feed themselves and take care of their families. As part of the program you can buy these as a gift for a friend or family member or a pastor (I got 2 goats last year. It seems like I always get goats. I'm not sure what that means). Your family or friends will then know you care for them, while at the same time you will fulfill Christ's mission to "feed the hungry." By simple, intentional steps like this, I believe we can begin to take this "cultural holiday" and transform it into a "Christian Holy Day".

## **Finance Report**

The following are the financial results through the end of October. Income from congregational gifts and tithes is \$250,024 which is about 9% below budget. Operating expenses are about 6% below budget. Total operating income is \$289,647. Total expenses are \$293,360 for an operating shortfall of about \$3,713. At the November 17 meeting, the Ad Council approved the Finance Committee's recommended budget of \$369,000 for 2006.

## Video System Installation

The Ad Council has approved the installation of a new video projector system in the sanctuary. The Worship Technology team recommended a system including two ceiling mounted projectors, two remote-controlled retractable screens and a computer and controls. The screens will be mounted on either side of the sanctuary in the general location of the existing screen. The computer and controls will be mounted in the existing sound console.

The Ad Council approved spending \$15,000 on the installation. The cost will be covered by an individual donation of \$10,000 and a \$5,000 gift from the memorial committee.

The video system installation will be coordinated with a Trustee project to install three ceiling fans in the sanctuary. The plan is to have the installation completed by the end of the year.


