World Vision's 30-Hour Famine is here once again and we are very excited to be participating for the 3rd year in a row.

This year's 30 Hour Famine will be held on February 25th and 26th and Famine Sunday is February 27th at both services. Any Jr. or Sr. High student may participate. We ask participants to begin fasting on Friday at 3pm and we break the fast together with communion and then a potluck dinner at 9pm on Saturday.

During this 30 hours we drink water and 100% fruit juice. The participants are at the church almost the entire time participating in Bible studies, learning about the poor around the world and specifically in the country that will benefit from the funds that we raise. We will be praying, doing a service project, and of course playing games and having tons of fun in fellowship! We do leave the church once or twice—for our service project and this year we may play laser tag or go ice-skating!

Participants ask family and friends to sponsor them before the Famine weekend—every \$30.00 they raise can feed a hungry child for one month. This is an amazing, eye-opening, and spiritual weekend for the participants and everyone else that is involved.

This year there are many opportunities for everyone at ORUMC to be involved and I hope that you will consider it! We will need a lot of 100% fruit juice and we would love to have some donations. If you are able to do that, please bring it to church by February 20. We need volunteers to be at church during the Famine hours and also to drive to our off-site activities.

Finance Committee Update 1/20/2005

With the help of part of the Cell Cross rental income from Sprint, *Our Redeemer's* has closed the books on 2004. Our Regular Envelope Income from pledges and other congregational giving was below budget by 7.5%. We have been able to meet all of our obligations, salaries and expenses using about half of the Sprint Cross Tower income.

Expenses were below budget by 3 %, but total Income was below budget by 8 %. In 2004, our Income from Pledges and other worship offerings was \$307,950. Other income came from Christian Corners, Easter and Christmas offerings, etc. totaled \$26,800.

We have paid our Conference apportionment in full. In addition, from our Sprint Income Tithe (10% of the Sprint income), we have given to several Rainbow Covenant Missions. The balance of the Sprint income (\$12,200) was placed in the reserve fund.

It is the goal of the Finance Committee to cover our expenses without using the Sprint Income from the Cross Tower. We can support *Our Redeemer's* mission better if we have the Sprint Income available to expand ministries, for example, for the addition of a position such as second pastor or Christian education leader.
