Through the years, I've submitted a number of devotions to The Upper Room for their consideration. It seems an appropriate way to thank that devotional for all the inspiration and guidance it's given to me. They've actually published a couple of my entries; more often they politely decline them.

I wrote this piece a few years ago and shared it with our Administrative Council. I also shared it with Don Weibel and Richard Vales, the two heroes of the story. (They, of course, denied their sainthood.) Since it won't be published in the Upper Room, I wanted to share it with our congregation. It's based on Hebrews 13:2 "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares."

We have a saint in our church congregation; his name is Richard. Actually we haven't seen Richard for years. He went on a business trip to the Philippines where he heard a call to serve the needy children he saw. Richard sold

his possessions to live in poverty as he serves these impoverished children of God.

We have another saint in our church congregation; his name is Don. Don's service to God is not as dramatic as Richard's, yet I cannot imagine our church functioning without him. Through his many years of church membership, Don has filled just about every position and performed every task. Now, in retirement, Don is all the more a blessing to our church. When no one else will do a job, Don is there to do it.

When Richard first visited our church, it was Don who met him in the parking lot and walked him in under an open umbrella. Shortly after that act of kindness Richard decided to join our church. And it was through church membership that Richard became the Christian he is today.

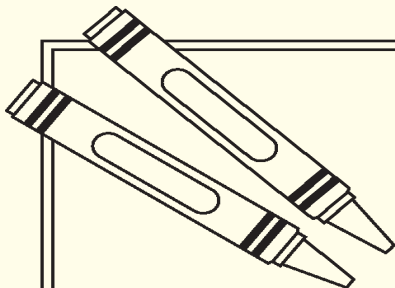
