Meals for Millions Lenten Program Report

Over forty families of Our Redeemer's participated in the Society of St. Andrew's (SOSA) program "Jesus Remember Me " and the Good Friday fast to fight hunger during Lent. Through their generosity and contributions to the Ash Wednesday offering \$1,440.12 was raised to provide food for the hungry through SOSA's Meals for Millions program.

Meals for Millions is a mission project of the United Methodist Men. Funds raised have provided millions of meals of potatoes and other food to the hungry. The funds are used to salvage and transport food (especially potatoes), that is perfectly good quality, but is not suitable for commercial use due to size or shape.

Gleaning is another activity aimed at salvaging food to feed the hungry. We will keep you informed as the growing season progresses. We began our church involvement in 2003 and would like to have Our Redeemer's participate on a larger scale this year. Any questions please see John Machonis.

The ORUMC Annual Rummage Sale was a tremendous success due to the WON-DERFUL Ladies and Gentlemen and Boy Scouts (leaders) who worked diligently to get things ready for the sale, sold at the sale and then purchased something. Thank you also to all the people that donated their treasures.

Our final total after expenses is approximately \$4,300.00 (which will be donated to charity and ORUMC). We donated swimsuits and underwear to the Crisis Center, 19 boxes of books to the Schaumburg Library, 25 boxes to Church World Service, 11 boxes to Prisoner Release (Men) and 8 boxes to Prisoner Release (Momen). We sent many, many boxes, 5 suit cases, 1 lamp & 2 TV's to the Salvation Army and a truck load of computer parts to a resale computer store. One of the most interesting items that we had this year was an organ and it found a home at a near by church.

We did \$10.00 bag sales (clothing only) on Friday and Saturday morning, and on Saturday afternoon we did \$5.00 bag sales (anything that could fit into a brown paper bag). This not only helps us to clean up, but it helps those that are needy in our area.

After 4 months, ORUMC continues to have a strong financial picture. The total Easter offering was \$4244. Even though Congregational gifts and tithes are 7 % below budget, expenses are 16 % below budget.

Expenses are low due to 2 major factors. We had a mild winter so the cost of snow removal was below budget. The budget includes salary for an Education Director and that position has not been filled.
