Dear Our Redeemer's

I was able to give out over 100 bags of food this week. Everyone gets a Christian book worth about \$4.95 in the store. I ordered 600 more and will get them delivered in the Philippines native language. I do not pay for the book and I do not have to pay for delivery.

I have several teams of people who help me in all that I do. I have people who go with me when I get the food and people who help pack the food, weigh it out, and give it out. None of these people get paid but sometimes I can provided them with a snack like a drink and bread for there help.

In each bag of food there is a note telling the people who receive the food the name of the person or church who has provided the money to buy the food and I ask them to say a prayer for them. We also give an invitation to the people to a local church if they can figure out how to get there. Sometimes we can arrange for someone to bring them back. I always get several pastors and pastor's assistants to come with us. After they receive the food they get together and pray with them and their families. We lay a plastic tarp not he ground for the children to sit on and the teachers tell them stores and play games with them. We teach them songs and prayers and tell them stores about Jesus.

On my last visit out to the field several people were crying and when I asked why they said no one has ever come to help them no one cares about them. There was a lady who was over 50 years old and said I was the first person to come and help them. Before we go to a place we send people out weeks in advance to check out the people so that we know who is the most needy. These people are not lazy. They just have no way to care for their families. We have the people line up and give out the food, cross there names off of the list that was provided and have them sign a thank you note and then pray with them.

My ministry is growing bigger all of the time. When I first arrived here I had no help and now there are so many people who are helping me with this important ministry. I continue to give out WWJD bracelets, make a daily devotional card holder, a children's Bible game, cakes and cookies that I sell to get money for food. So all of this keeps me quite busy. My day starts at 5:30 AM and ends around 12:00 PM and except for lunch and dinner I never stop working. I do not tell you this to feel sorry for me I tell you his to show you how much I am dedicated to this work and loving every minute of it. I am so blessed that the Lord gave me this work!!

An update on my health-I am getting better each day but it is a slow progress. I have pain all of the time but it is not as bad as before. I can now do more things than I could before. Praise the Lord. Thank you all for your prayers-PRAYERS DO WORK.

DOLLARS SENSE

Credit Seminar

Shirley Odegaard attended a Credit Seminar at Heritage Bank recently. Shirley wrote a summary of the information presented at the seminar. You can get a copy of Shirley's complete summary in the office.

The following is a condensed version touching on a few of the high points of the seminar. Shirley's complete summary addresses precautions that should be followed to maintain a clean credit record and minimize the chance of identity theft.

- 1. You are entitled by law to a free credit report given by the 3 credit companies every year. Check them annually.
- 2. The Credit Companies score your credit history and give that information to banks, mortgage companies, and other credit companies.
- 3. There is new credit and old credit. New credit is any credit that doesn't have a history of payment. Old credit is your history of payment of mortgage, car loans, and credit cards.
- 4. When you get a new credit card don't sign it. Instead write "Check ID" the clerk will then have to ask for your driver's license or other photo ID.
- 5. Try to make all of your credit payments on time. Late payments affect credit rating.

- 6. A rule of thumb for credit card debt is not to carry more than 75% of the credit limit on any card. (eg. Limit \$10,000 no more than \$7,500.)
- 7. When you consolidate your credit card debt into a new credit card, it creates debt without a history of payment that can affect your ranking score.
- 8. Reconcile your bank statement every month.
- 9. Save your credit card receipts. When your bill is received, check your purchases against the receipts.

The Three Credit Bureaus are: Equifax: (800) 685-1111 Experian (formerly TRW): (888) 397-3742 TransUnion: (800) 888-4213

If you think your identity has been stolen:

- 1. Contact the fraud department of any of the 3 bureaus.
- 2. Close accounts that you believe have been tampered with.
- 3. File a police report and give to all your creditors.
- 4. File a complaint with the FTC call Toll Free 1-877-IDTHEFT.



Finance Committee Report

Below is the Finance Summary as of the end of July as reported in the Finance Meeting on Tuesday August 16.

Regular envelope income is \$178,000 which is 8% below budget, but 4% ahead of July, 2004. July was a 5 Sunday month, but considering it was the height of the summer, Finance is pleased we are ahead of last year.

Total income (including Sprint) is \$207,000 and total expenses are \$201,000, so our overall picture is in the black. July expenses include more than half of the total cost of the new windows from Home Depot. The rest will follow, probably this month or next.

Budgeting process will begin in September for all committees with expenses to be included in the 2006 Budget. Letters and summary reports for the last 12 months will go to each committee head.

Our Charge conference is October 2, which is early this year. Finance will not be submitting a final 2006 budget for approval at that time, since the Consecration Lunch and EMC gifts will still be in progress. Tour of Hindu Temple

On Monday, July 18, 2005, a group us from *Our Redeemer's* and friends visited the BAPS - Shri Swaminarayan Mandir Hindu Temple. The temple is located on Route 59 just south of Army Trail Road in Bartlett, Illinois. A tour guide was waiting for us and showed us where to place our shoes (shoes are not permitted in the facility or Mandir). No mini skirts or shorts either. He explained a lot of information about the Hindu faith and answered many of our questions before we even started the tour.

The education facility was dedicated in 2000. The Mandir (Temple) was dedicated in August of 2004 with a 15-day celebration. The gardens have not been completed and I am sure they will be beautiful when finished.

The Hindu faith dates back over 11,000 years, and started in caves in the Himalayan Mountains. The Hindu prays 5 times a day. They believe that everyone receives blessings from God in the form of Wind, Water, Fire, Earth, and Light. There are followers of the Hindu faith all over the world.

The education facility is made primarily of hand carved teakwood that was carved in India and shipped here for assembly. The Mandir is 8000 tons of marble (much of it from Italy) again hand carved in India and brought here for assembly, almost exclusively by volunteers! There are no metal supports in either building. Everything is perfectly fitted together, much like a log cabin or Lego's. All of us agreed that it is breathtakingly beautiful.

The Education Facility and Mandir are handicapped assessable and there is an elevator for those that have trouble walking the stairs and there are a lot of marble stairways. There are no windows in the Mandir so light is provided by fiber optics that are run through the numerous pillars to the roof and steeples. The paintings, statues, and lighting are beautiful.

We had an opportunity to attend a brief prayer service in which candles were lit and passed in the congregation by volunteers, you hold your hands over the flame for a brief moment and then rub your hands over your head. That is a blessing from God. Men and women sit in different parts of the marble floor (no pews, benches, or chairs) or stand in the rear.

The only other Mandir in the United States is in Houston, Texas. There are several located in other parts of the world. The Temple is open for tours from 9:00 a.m. to noon daily at no charge. It is well worth the time and effort to learn about another faith.

I was glad that I was able to arrange and take part of this tour. It was beautiful.
