Take 45+ adults, 100+ children, 450 food pantry items, 1 wheelbarrow of mud, 1 bail of straw, 4 family style meals, 15 bottles of tempera paint, several goats and bunnies, real frankincense and myrrh, 36 batches of unleavened bread, mix it all together with community, fellowship, and prayer and you will get a heaping helping of family fun.

Children of *Our Redeemer's*, Christian Corner, and the surrounding community banded together to learn first hand the stories, customs, occupations, and recipes of Jesus' life and times. Even larger than the concepts learned was the fellowship, community, and excitement in the air at Vacation Bible School. The Education Committee took on 3 major projects within VBS this year including an evening dinner, evening VBS, and a daytime VBS for Christian Corner. Our Redeemer's was able to "have it all" so to speak.

For the first time dinner was served to the families of workers and the families attending Vacation Bible School. This turned out to be a big hit as *Our Redeemer's* had the chance to get to know each other and the families of our daycare. Approximately 40 or more adults and children shared in a meal each night prior to the start of VBS. The kick off dinners eased the stress of people rushing to VBS and gave an opportunity for some old fashioned church fellowship.

45+ adults of all ages came together as Tribal Parents, Shop Keepers, Organizers, Drama Team Members, Kitchen Helpers, Nursery Attendants, Set Up, and Tear Down Crews. Our children are so lucky to have the chance to connect with so many different adults at *Our Redeemer's*. Many parents commented that their typically "shy" children could not wait to come every night and many did not want it to end. Even the older 5th and 6th graders who are sometimes more difficult to please gave Marketplace rave reviews.

The Education Committee would like to thank everyone who planned, worked, donated items, and prayed for Vacation Bible School to be a success. The efforts of many showed in the success. If you were not able to attend with or without children, you might want to clear your calendar for next year. Even if you do not have children, it was still fun to experience the excitement in the air.

Some church members could not resist coming to the church and watching the fun. Many church members who remembered Marketplace from the past quickly signed up this time around because they "remembered how much fun it was before" or said, "Marketplace was their children's favorite VBS memory."

Rumor has it that next year St. Paul may be traveling with a band of shopkeepers to *Our Redeemer's* or possibly Bethlehem may be recreated. If you were unable to attend it might be worth planning your vacation around it next year. The kids loved this "outside of the box" hands on approach to learning.

However, many adults saw some more important benefits for kids in the relationships formed with other positive adults within the church. Members and visitors alike commented on how excited their children were to return to Vacation Bible School each night.

Our future is in our children and it is built more upon the meaningful relationships they build with a variety of adults than it is upon the type of event, approach, or activity. The availability of dads, grandparents, and cross generational volunteers made these connections possible.

Isaiah Chapter 55 Verse 2 "Why do you spend money for what is not bread, And your wages for what does not satisfy? Listen carefully to Me, and eat what is good, And delight yourself in abundance."

The stewardship committee will offer guidance in the stewardship of your resources. The quotation from Isaiah highlights a financial problem that has been around for thousands of years. Once the basic necessities have been taken care of, what do you spend your money on? Often, it is **things that do not satisfy.** How many of us are still paying interest to the credit card company for a restaurant meal we ate three years ago, or an electronic gadget we do not use, or an article of clothing we never wear? Things so rarely satisfy.

What does satisfy? Good health - a quick walk is free. Family and friends - spend some time with them instead of at the mall. Deepen your relationship with God - God values time with you more than He needs your money. The "interest" we earn on investments in our health and our relationships will pay us back for years to come.

If you can control those spending impulses, give items you no longer need to charity, transfer credit card balances to eliminate interest charges for six months, spend time with family and friends, and exercise physically, mentally and spiritually, you will find you are happier and more satisfied.


