Many of us come to church to feel the grace of God in Jesus Christ, to be strengthened in our daily walk with Christ, and to share fellowship with one another. Hi, this is Rev. Richard from the Philippines. Just a short report on how things are going. As far as my health is concerned, it's about the same, maybe a little worse, but as I have learned I thank God for the good he has given me and also for the pain I have.

Hungry people are all around me and I know that I cannot feed them all, but I will feed as many as I can, with the help of your church and the others who send me money for food. I thank you for the money you have sent me already and I will pray that you will continue to send me money for food each and every month.

Every person I feed I feed in the name of the person that has sent me money for food I buy and give out. I am here 8 years now and miss all of you and all of my family very much. I am doing what God has called me to do and with your help I will keep on feeding hungry people, until I am taken from this earth.

Please know that 100% that is every single penny that you send me goes to buy food for the hungry people. I am living off my SS and I give 30% of it to help buy what the hungry people need. I am telling you this because I need you to believe that I am doing all I can to feed as many hungry people as I can with the money you send me. Just as a quick example, in the 8 years I have been here I have spent to date less than \$50.00 on my clothing. This is because I am still O.K. with the clothing I brought when I came here. I need nothing except your love and support. The only thing that is important to me is feeding hungry people. I many many times go to bed and cry because I cannot feed more hungry people, and I remember the people I was not able to give food to. I am 100% devoted to this cause and I am so thankful for all your prayers, support and love. Which without I could not carry on. I know that you all have many problems in your life, and I also realize that the people I feed are very far away from you and you do not see the hunger and the pain they are in. I know the Lord will bless ORUMC and all it's members for your most gracious help.

I ask for your prayers on a daily basis to help me continue here and to also inspire many people to send money to feed more hungry people. I promise each and every one of you that when we meet in heaven I will be there waiting for you and give you the biggest hug you have ever had, and thank you personally for all your help in feeding the hungry people.

May you all have a fantastic Christmas and happy New Year, and may the Lord bless you and everyone in you life and give you the best year in 2006. May his love be with you at all times and may you feel his arms around you always.

Finance Report

The following are the financial results through the end of November. Income from congregational gifts and tithes is \$273,490 which is about 8% below budget. Operating expenses are about 8% below budget. Total operating income of \$327,163 includes \$11,000 that was transferred from the capital account to pay for window replacement in the Wesley Hall. Total expenses are \$320,091 for an operating surplus of about \$7,072 (after the \$11,000 transfer).

At the November 17 meeting the Ad Council approved the Finance Committee's recommended budget of \$369,000 for 2006. This is down \$10,000 from 2005 total of \$379,000 primarily because Staff Parish took out the 2nd pastor salary that was part of the 2005. As of December 13 projected 2006 congregational gifts and tithes is \$329,000. If all commitments are received, that will cover 89% of expenses.
