

Summer Worship Schedule

Our Redeemer's has been an exciting place to be in this last year. A number

of important things have been happening. Let me share just a few of those with you. Beginning last fall we have been involved in a process of evaluation called Natural Church Development, to make our ministry stronger. In our Nominations team we have been exploring ways to help people more effectively answer their call to servant ministry in the church. Our Staff-Parish and Finance committees have recently worked together to recommend a new part time staff person whose focus will be evangelism and discipleship. Our Worship and Music teams have been meeting to strengthen our times of worship, our worship time might grow, not just in numbers, but as a time for all of us to grow spiritually. Our Youth Council has worked to re-organize our confirmation program, recruiting six adults to be small group leaders and mentors to our 7th and 8th grade students. Finally, I would like to say a word about our youth mission teams for the summer. Our Appalachian Service Project will be taking 43 youth and adults to Kentucky this year. In addition, our youth program has organized a 7-member mission team to travel to New Orleans to help with the clean up from last year's hurricanes. Overall, we are taking 50 people on mission trips this summer. That is truly amazing.

I know as summer comes along many of us are planning vacations and long weekends with family and friends. These "Sabbath times" are so important for all of us, regardless of whether we travel, or just stay home with our families. This year our family is planning a week in the Smoky Mountains as a family.

Yet as we move into summer I would also like to encourage you to make a commitment to being in worship. The more we as followers of Christ connect to each other in worship, the more we grow disciples, and strengthen each other within our church family. Vacation Bible School Marketplace A.D. July 10-13, 6:30-8:30 p.m.

All children ages 3yrs. through 6th grade and their friends are encouraged to attend Marketplace A.D. at Our Redeemer's. Marketplace is a simulation of a biblical city complete with costumes, tribal parents, biblical dramas, singing, and the Marketplace. This concept is completely hands on and does not require any paper / pencil activities. In other words, this VBS is all about learning through the art of play. Most of the Marketplace occurs outside and shops include brick making (playing in the mud), jewelry making, carving, candy maker, a petting zoo and much more. Children will have the opportunity to choose which "shops" they want to attend each night. In the past we have had some kids make a brick every single night. Where else are kids encouraged to play in the mud?

We are asking that each child who attends VBS bring a nutritious snack such as fruit, crackers, trail mix, etc to share during the week. We already have plenty of juice.

Our mission will be to collect enough food pantry items to line the edge of the sanctuary two times by the end of the week. We would like each child to bring a food item every night so the children may see the "parade of food" grow by the end of VBS. Children are also encouraged to bring a friend. Every child who brings a friend will receive a special prize for themselves and their friend. Our Redeemer's offers the only VBS in the area that is free of charge. We thank all members for supporting this outreach to the community.

Dear ORUMC Members:

Happy belated Easter to you and all your family. Sorry this email is so long in coming. I went out with 15 people 2 days before Easter to pass out food to 500 people just enough food for Easter. We ended up staying 10 days. There was so much to do and so much we could do to help these people. We did a lot of good and taught young and old alike about Jesus. We also brought them books about Jesus.

I was glad that we were able to help these people. I wish we could have done more. But to give you an example of what we did, is we helped people with there cuts and sores that they had by disinfecting them and putting bandages on them. We washed many, many children and helped wash older adults. We helped brush teeth and wash and comb hair. All this to make them feel a little better.

We helped then clean up around the area and also we cleared an area and planted vegetable seeds we had brought with us. We also brought them baby chickens, 200 of them and some food for the baby chicks. And once the chicks will grow up they will have 200 chickens to eat.

I am trying to get more baby chickens to give to families to raise and then sell so they can make a small living and also once sold they will have money to buy more chicks, and start the process all over again. (as JESUS says in the Bible, do not give them fish, but teach them how to fish.)

All in all this was my best Easter ever? I

guess I will never get used to sleeping in the out door on the ground. But as I said all in all it was great. I pray that Easter was good for all of you. Before I close I know that because I am far away from everyone it is easy to forget about the hungry people here. I only know that I come to you all the time begging for your help in the name of the hungry people here.

Anything you can do to help will give some one who might not eat some food. If everyone in the church gave \$1.00 per month that would help a lot. The more money the more people that eat. And to me \$1.00 per month doesn't seem too much to ask. It amounts to 3.33 cents a day.

Please see what you can do to help feed these people.

Over forty families of *Our Redeemer's* participated in the Society of St. Andrew's (SOSA) program "Crossroads" and the Good Friday fast to fight hunger during Lent. Through their generosity and contributions to the Maundy Thursday offering \$1,495.99 was raised to provide food for the hungry through SOSA's Meals for Millions program.

Meals for Millions is a mission project of the United Methodist Men. Funds raised have provided millions of meals of potatoes and other food to the hungry. The funds are used to salvage and transport food (especially potatoes), that is perfectly good quality but, is not suitable for commercial use due to size or shape.

Gleaning is another activity aimed at salvaging food to feed the hungry. We will keep you informed as the growing season progresses.
