


- 1. Empowering Leadership

#### Volunteers Needed:

# New Voting Equipment

New voting equipment will be in place at *Our Redeemer's* and other county voting precincts for the March 21 primary election. The new equipment will replace the punch card system that has been used in the past.

Two types of system will be used. One is a touch screen system where the votes will be recorded by touching the ballot display on a computer screen. The other is an optical scan system where the votes will be recorded by marking a paper ballot.

In both systems the ballot will be checked electronically before the final vote is recorded. If the voter has under voted or over voted the system will warn the voter and allow him to correct the error before the vote is finally tabulated. In both systems a paper trail is provided that can be used for a recount. Look for more information in the newspapers as Election Day approaches.

Keep bringing in calendars for women in prison. Leave them in the bookcase at the north end of the Narthex. Thank you for contributing over 200 of these each year.





