Faith Foundation Worship Series

During Lent (our time of Easter preparation) we talked about the book of Revelation as a book of hope and faith, not fear and violence. Our *worship team* worked hard at making those services meaningful and relevant. I would like to especially thank **Cathy Scott** and our choir for their powerful Good Friday service.

In a story from Matthew (7:24), Jesus tells us that all those who hear his teachings and act on them are like those who build their house on a solid rock, it will stand firm. During our Easter season, our worship services are focused on certain "foundational practices" that help us keep our "faith life" on solid rock. These practices include:

1) Making a commitment to **PRAY** regularly (pray in a style that suites you, find a routine, use imagery, keep it simple, continue to learn about prayer).

2) Make a commitment to do **BIBLE STUDY** (scripture is not a textbook of things past, but a living document that opens our hearts to the Risen Lord).

3) Make a commitment to be in **WOR-SHIP** (time spent in worship is always an opportunity to feel God's love and share it with your church family).

4) Make a commitment to your **FAM-ILY** (on Mother's day we will look at our families and ways to grow in faith with them).

5) Make a commitment to **JOY**, to celebrating God's love (on music Sunday, May 21, we will celebrate the gift of music God has given us).

I look forward to seeing all of you in worship during our Easter season.



Our Redeemer's Food Pantry

Last month's *Redeemer Review* featured an article about the Schaumburg Township Food Pantry and our church's on-going support of this caring ministry. But did you know that *Our Redeemer's* has its own food pantry as well?

It is not unusual for hungry neighbors to come visit our church requesting food. Many years ago **Becky Schultz**, our church secretary at that time, suggested we stock food items to have on hand to feed these children of God. The church has a cabinet filled with food items these neighbors can choose from.

Although it's hardly in her "job description/' **Donna Echtner**, our current secretary, serves by maintaining this pantry. Donna says that helpful items include: Ready to eat soups, macaroni and cheese, pudding cups, fruit cups, cereal, peanut butter, jelly, crackers, juice and baby food. Other items often requested are toilet paper, diapers, laundry soap, dish soap, hand soap, toothpaste, canned meats and canned fruits. Jewel certificates in small amounts are a good idea also. These are kept in **Pastor Bill's** office and he oversees these and passes them out. If you would like to contribute food to *Our Redeemer's* food pantry, please drop them off in the office or place them in the cabinet next to the sink between the offices anytime.
