
Celebration Sunday October 29, 2006



On Sunday October 29 we will be celebrating at worship. At both our 9:00 and 10:30 a.m. services we will celebrate the ministries of *Our Redeemer's*. As many of you know, we have much to celebrate. This year our leadership has been active organizing ministries and missions for the purpose of showing the love of Jesus Christ. This year at Vacation Bible School we ministered to over 70 children, many not from our church. In our mission trips this year forty-one youth and adults worked on the Appalachian Service Project, while eight went to New Orleans, to help with the re-building from hurricane Katrina. Our Voices of Light youth drama group put on the musical Godspell with over 30 youth participating as actors, musicians and technical support. Last year at Christmas we continued our tradition of giving with Gifts from the Heart, as well as becoming an ark church by raising \$6,000 for the Heifer project. We have also continued support our United Methodist con-

nection in our conference and globally by remaining faithful to our apportionment giving, supporting mission and ministry throughout the world. Our Caring Ministries Council continues to help people in ministries of giving through the food pantry, the Crisis Center, Habitat for Humanity and the soup kitchen in Roger's Park. Last year we initiated our Micah Ministries team, to ask how we might work for justice on behalf of Christ and his ministry of love. Beginning on October 1 we will add a new part time staff person. Carolyn Meneely will join our staff as the Director of Discipleship. Finally, (although these are only some of the highlights), we are working with the Natural Church Development program of our conference to strengthen our organization and ministry to reach out into our community more effectively. It's time to celebrate!
