"633" Worship

On Sunday September 9 we will begin our new worship service. This third service will begin at 6:33 on Sunday evenings. The time was chosen based on a scripture passage from the gospel of Matthew.

Steep your life in God-reality, God-initiative, God-provisions. Don't worry about missing out. You'll find all your everyday human concerns will be met.

Matthew 6:33

We chose this passage because of its powerful call on each of us to focus our lives on the love of God that we can know in Jesus Christ. As well as providing a time for worship other than Sunday morning, the service will provide different ways to worship, to learn and to encounter Jesus Christ for our lives. As a worship team we are planning to use drama, visuals, videos and different formats for the weekly message.

The primary purpose of the service is to "provide interactive experiences to bring Christ into our everyday lives, further define and strengthen our walk with God, and provide opportunities and vision to carry out

His kingdom work on earth". In addition our new worship band, *Ember Days* will lead us in music for each service.



As we have planned this service we have not pulled back from worship on Sunday morning at our 9:00 am and 10:30 am services. Our music and worship teams have already begun planning these services through the spring of 2008.

The addition of an evening service will do two important things for us as a worshipping community. First it will provide a different way of encountering the gospel message. By doing this we hope to more fully engage younger people and families with Christ's message of love and grace. Although the service will be directed at youth and young families, people of all ages are encouraged to attend. Secondly, it will offer another worship time for those that are unable to attend on Sunday morning. Please continue to pray for the church and our worship planners as we begin a new phase in our worship life at *Our Redeemer's*.

Natural Church Development

You've probably heard about the Natural Church Development program. Or maybe you have heard it referred to as NCD. (You know how we love acronyms.) It is an important initiative for our church. It is a way to identify the strength or weakness of various factors that impact church growth. At first, you may think of growth in church membership, but these factors influence spiritual growth as well.

NCD uses an analogy of a church as an old-fashioned barrel – made out of wooden staves. Every barrel has the same staves, but they are slightly different in length. Think of a sturdy well-aged barrel that has a productive life, a little worn but still a long way from being thrown out. Each barrel can hold only as much water as its shortest staff will allow.

The staves represent the eight quality characteristics or factors, measured through the NCD program. (Listed below) The shortest staff represents the minimum factor; the longest staff represents the maximum factor. Remember, *Our Redeemer's* minimum factor was Need-Oriented Evangelism. And Empowering Leadership and Loving Relationships were our maximums. The congregation is the water – to add water, the shortest staff needs to be lengthened. But it is also important to keep the other staves strong.

Our strongest staff is Empowering Leadership. It is more than committees and work teams. It is members who support each other in the church to achieve the spiritual potential that God has for them. In growing churches, the emphasis is on strong relationships and partnerships among the members and less on specific goals or project orientations.

Loving Relationships focus on the "love quotient" within the church – measuring the time we spend with each other outside of church-sponsored events. It includes the joys and concerns we share for each other – the laughter, the tears, the moments of worry, the helping hands in time of need.

It is reassuring and gratifying to know that our strongest staves are such positive qualities. Next month I'll write more about the other characteristics.

About 1 week ago I received the check you sent me and I thank you ever, ever so much from me personally and also on behalf of the people that received food but cannot thank you personally themselves. Also at that time I also received checks from a few other people. This enables me to buy food for close to 500 people and that is GREAT. Thank you one and all. My bank gives me the money right away and I do not have to wait for your check to clear your bank. That way I can get food right away and start passing it out.

We were in the fields for one week and fed many people adults and children and I got home real tired. I still cannot get use to sleeping in the open air on the ground but it was well worth it. If you could only see the faces on the people receiving the food and the children eating it so fast it is awesome. The Lord has really blessed me by giving me this job and double blessed me by having you all as my friends and supporters. And He has also blessed the people we feed as we try to help as many people as we can.

As all you know I am up in age and I am the oldest member in my church here. And I am believing I will live to be over 100 as I do the work God has given me to do. I have many things wrong with me health wise but because of the work I am doing I never worry

about the pain. The pain some time is very bad but not as bad as the pain the hungry people go thru. Well my question is as long as I am on the face of this earth doing God's work can I count on your support until God takes me from this earth. It really makes me think about all the help you are giving me and I know that the people who are hungry also need that support.

I will never forget you all in all you have done. All the money and the things you have sent (food, medicine, tooth brushes). Oh so many things. God bless you all. I also went to 12 hospitals and took a can of juice and a small package of crackers to each and every person we visited. I was with 15 people and we asked them what was wrong and we all knelt down by their bed side all holding hands with them and placing our hand all over their bodies and as I prayed for them. I had one of our people translate it so they could understand it. It was great. One lady who was visiting her husband called me aside and said "we are not Christians as we do not believe, but as you prayed my husband said he felt a calm come over him and he say he liked the calm a lot. Thank you so much". WOW Great. things are happening. Thank you all everyone and please when I am 100 or older please stay with me.

The 6:33 committee is hosting a movie night featuring the documentary film, *The Invisible Children*. The documentary was made by filmmakers **Jason Russell, Bobby Bailey, and Laren Poole** from San Diego, California. Their goal is to create awareness regarding the plight of the people of Northern Uganda, caught in the midst of a civil war between the government and a rebel group that makes extensive use of kidnapping children and making child soldiers. Statistics show that 50,000 Ugandan children are abducted each year to become child soldiers.

The filmmakers also created *Invisible Children Inc* in an attempt to give people a way to easily help with the situation in Northern Uganda, after viewing the film.
