#### *"Flash Forward: Owning Our Future"*

Would you want to know your future? *"Flash Forward"* is a new TV show set up around the idea of knowing what will happen to you in 6 months. God wants each of us to live a full and loving life; today and into the future. Yet it often feels like forces within us, and outside of us, work against us. The story of Jacob & Esau helps us see how we can *"own our future"* even when things we have difficulty and uncertainty in our lives. Join us in November for worship as we explore the story of Jacob & Esau.

#### **November 1: *Finding the Window***

Some say that when God closes a door he opens a window. Many of us know about "doors" that close on us. On this communion Sunday we will celebrate the lives of those we have lost, as well as look for the windows that God is opening in each of our lives.

**November 8: *What does your heart desire?***

In the story of Jacob and Esau, both brothers make decisions that affect their future. Esau seems a bit short sighted, while Jacob wants too much. How does the story of these two "dysfunctional" brothers speak to us about our future?

#### **November 15: *Power to Change: Wrestling with Angels***

In the story of Jacob and Esau's reunion both have changed. Esau, who wanted to kill his brother, meets Jacob who had wrestled with God. How do we, as people like Jacob and Esau, acquire the power to change?

#### **November 22: *Own Your Future***

After Esau and Jacob are reunited they make an interesting decision, they go their separate ways. As followers of Jesus Christ, how can we claim our own unique future as a child of God, and a disciple of Jesus?

I can't tell you in words what that meant, how touched I was and overwhelmed with emotion and gratitude that these people would come out on this very cold, cold day to volunteer to help our family and also hundreds of others deal with this pain of suicide.

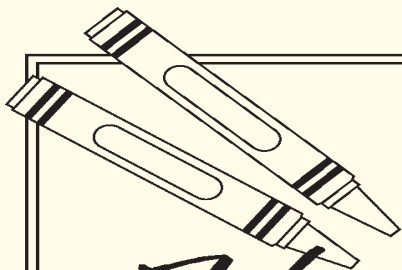

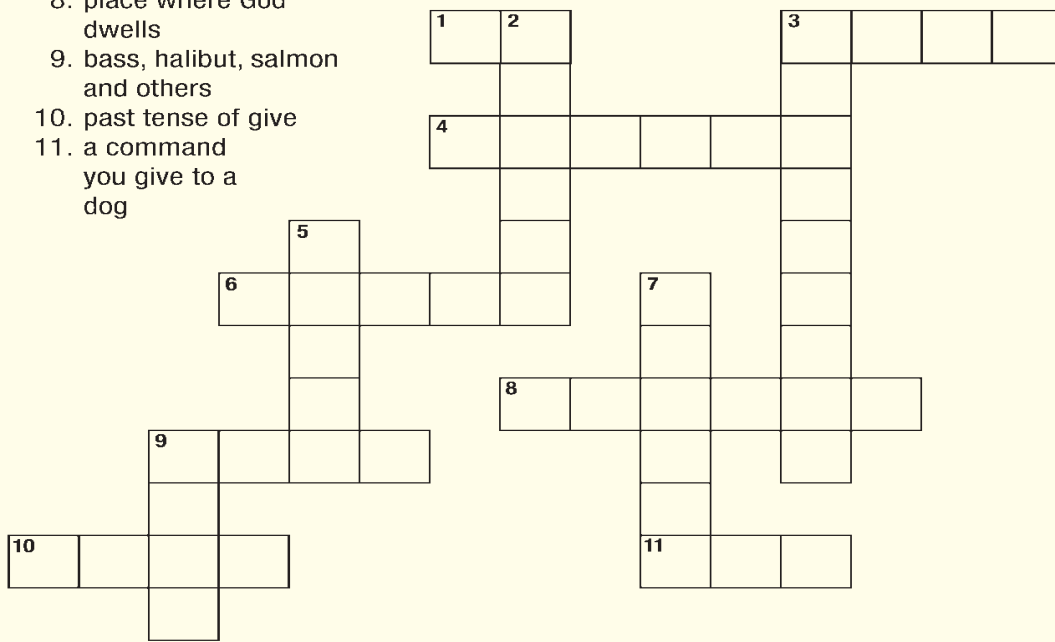
