One of the reflections of the development of the character of Christ in a human heart is the capacity to give thanks to and receive thanks from other people. We are to live a life of thanksgiving with each other. Sometimes that means saying thanks for the blessing we receive from others. I have noticed that we often have trouble with *"thanksliving"*—a way of life. I don't know why.

Perhaps, we think that we lose some of ourselves in giving thanks to others. Over the years, I have learned that we really gain a new portion of our redeemed selves when we give some of ourselves away in *thanksliving*. One of my personal habits is to try to thank the people around me for the things that they do



that others many not seem to notice. It gives me a sense of purpose when I can build another person up.

Perhaps, we fear that we contribute to puffing another person up if we shower them with thanks and affirmation. This does not seem to be in the spirit of the scriptural admonition to build one another up in love. My own personal conviction is that the world around us does enough to deflate our egos and that the Body of Christ should set the standard for affirming and celebrating one another. We have the chance to offer grace to each other when we show and share *thanksliving*.

Perhaps, we can try to be *thanksgiving* and *thanksliving* for Thanksgiving Day this month as we celebrate over the turkey meal with family and friends. What would happen if we do fast from saying not-so-good things (cont on pg. 2)

Once again, the congregation of *Our Redeemer's* has the chance to brighten the holidays for a child by providing gifts to children through the program, Gifts from the Heart.

This is the 26th year that the program Gifts from the Heart has been implemented here. Members of the congregation are given the opportunity to sign up for the number of children they wish to sponsor. This year you may sign up in the narthex on October 28, November 4 and November 11.

New this year due to the economic times we are in, ChildServ requests that no more than *\$40* be spent on each child. The names and ages of the children you sponsor will be given to you on November 18 or November 25. Then the unwrapped gifts, bundled together for each child, are returned on Sunday, December 2, where they will be delivered to ChildServ by the Gifts from the Heart elves.

ChildServ, the United Methodist agency that serves foster and at-risk children, has been very appreciative of our congregation's efforts each year in providing gifts for children.

This year, more than any other in the recent past, it is important that we reach out to those who are so affected by the economy and are in need.

Gifts from the Heart has been very well supported by the *Our Redeemer's* congregation and I hope that, once again, you will find that it is a very worthy outreach to children, and you will find it in your heart to add another or several additional children to your Christmas list.
