Christ is Risen Christ is Risen. Christ is Risen indeed. Alleluia! Amen!

The recipients of the Good News offered these responses as a confession of faith. Imagine being huddled in fear after Good Friday and the disciples saw the empty cross as a symbol of death of Jesus Christ. They moved quickly to find a secure place to mourn the death of the beloved teacher, friend, healer, companion and Rabbi. The door was locked for fear of the unknown. Persecution was real. Death was real.

The following morning the women set out early to anoint the body of Jesus as was the custom. A tomb was made available by a man named Joseph. By the time the women arrived at the entrance of the tomb, the stone that was rolled up to seal the tomb was moved to the side. They were afraid and saw

the angel of the Lord. They were told, õHe is not here. He has risen.ö The women rushed back to tell the disciples about their discovery. Jesus revealed himself in a new way.

The reality of the resurrection did not immediately make sense until Jesus appeared before them and showed his hands, feet and sides.

A sense of awe and wonder filled the longing of their hearts.

The Psalmist declared, õBe still and know that I am God.ö

As I write, the United States and the whole world is dealing with a deadly virus and pandemic. There is much fear and uncertainty about our physical, spiritual and economic well being. We are more aware of our behav-

Our worship theme for the season is õJourney to the Dark Woodsö. We are in the dark wood moments right now but God surprised us with hope.

Please continue to pray for the world, our nation ,our community and our churches for such a time like these .Continue to give thanks to God and support our ministries in the best ways that we can. Together, we can continue to share the light of the world in Jesus.

May this Easter 2020 bless and renew our faith in Jesus Christ.

Youth News

The Staff Parish Relations Committee is seeking a qualified candidate for the position of Worship Music Director. If possible, we would like to fill this position by June 1, 2020. Please review the following job description and let us know if you or someone you know is interested in this position. Contact Mary Zalay or Jack Denny for more information.

Position Title: Worship Music Director

Accountable to: Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC)

Hours: Average of 12 hours per week

Compensation: As approved by Staff-Parish Relations Committee, Finance Committee, and Administrative Council

Qualifications:

- Christian character
- Leadership proficiency
- · Communication skills
- · Planning/organizational skills
- · Strong interpersonal skills
- Strong keyboard, vocal and instrumental skills

Responsibilities:

- 1. Coordinate (and lead, as necessary) congregational worship music for all services, (including traditional, blended, and contemporary worship,) as requested by the senior pastor and Music Committee
- 2. Provide contemporary music leadership for services, (weekly or as needed,) di-

recting the praise team and/or serving as song leader

- 3. Organize, rehearse, and direct praise teams weekly and Sunday mornings
- 4. Work with the senior pastor to plan worship services
- 5. Participate as an active member of Music and Worship Committee meetings
- 6. Communicate with senior pastor, administrative assistant and tech team to ensure music selections, copyright information, participating musicians and lyrics for projection are provided at worship services
- 7. Ensure that music is appropriately licensed and report music usage statistics when required by the agency

General Information:

In the event of emergency/sickness or planned absence, the Worship Music Director needs to notify the chairperson of the Music Committee OR the SPRC Liaison OR Administrative Assistant OR the Senior Pastor as far in advance of the absence as possible.

The Worship Music Director seeks qualified substitutes for necessary absences and provides for a substitute subject to the approval of the Music Committee.

If absences are due to being sick or an emergency, the Worship Music Director may miss (2) rehearsals and two (2) scheduled performances during the Church season, without deduction from salary (Sunday morning will be considered one absence).

Any function missed beyond these will result in a deduction from the salary equal to the amount budgeted to pay for a substitute, whether one is used or not.

The Worship Music Director will normally work 12 hours per week. Because some weeks will require many more than 12 hours, comp time may be taken through occasional consolidation of rehearsal time and/or occasional absence from Sunday morning services (maximum of 5 Sunday) subject to the approval of the senior pastor.

Stewardship - Practicing What You Preach

We we all heard the phrase operactice what you preach before. If certain that I we said those words in a hushed tone many times during my adulthood.

Sitting in my home office the other day finishing my 2019 tax returns I noted to myself that things were looking pretty good for the Murray household and a good-sized refund check was in the offing from Uncle Sam.

I opened a blank spreadsheet on the computer and began putting together a list of items where the money might be spent. The first thing that came to mind was the backyard deck needed to be painted; and with a newly painted deck we needed some updated patio furniture!

I put both on the list and remembering how Coral wanted to update the window coverings in the dining room I added a sum of money to cover the cost for new blinds. I put these and other õneedsö into the spreadsheet, ranked them by priority and assigned an expected cost to each.

As I reviewed these inecessaryø things we might spend our tax refund on, I happened to spot one of the iGenerosityø stones left over from last falløs stewardship campaign.

I had placed the stones around the house to keep me mindful of the pledge I took to be generous to others and be a good steward of Godøs gifts. I looked back at the list and saw a glaring omission. There was nowhere on the list that listed God as a beneficiary.

How many years had I been involved in Stewardship? How many times had I spoken on the virtue of giving to God a part of my finances? And more importantly, the importance of putting my Lord first on any list!

After discussing these thoughts with Coral, I went back to the spreadsheet and inserted a new line at the top of the list and inserted :Godøs Giftøassigning a portion of the tax refund to Him.

This addition quickly put the totals out of balance; however, both Coral and I found joy in eliminating some of other -necessaryøthings on the list.

This exercise reinforced my belief that financial giving; like service, witnessing, prayer, and presence; is a part of stewardship that cannot be relegated to a single campaign each autumn.

Gifting must be practiced throughout the year.

Were you one of the fortunate ones receiving a tax refund this year?

If so, have you taken this opportunity to give back to God some of the grace he has bestowed on you and your family?
