When I was growing up, we have a manual water pump (to supplemental our water from the city) and I recall õ primingö the pump with water so that the pump would function properly. Thereøs always a bucket with water and the habit was of course to make sure the bucket is filled How can we be renewed in the midst of many life changing moments? I read the prayer from Psalm 46. It was addressed to the *Koharites and the Alamoths;* worship leaders in the gathered assembly: *God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea, though*

its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble within its tumult.

God is steadfast. God is always renewing His creation. In this newsletter you will notice an invitation to join the United Methodist Men for its 27th annual meals for millions Lenten program. It is sponsored by the Society of St.

What's next for the United Methodist Church?

As you may know, many of the prominent news outlets have published a story about the future of the United Methodist church. The story speaks about a proposed settlement that would let a group of churches split off from the UMC and form a new õTraditionalö denomination. This plan was written by a diverse group of 16 people including bishops and other leaders who labored through a mediation process with a renowned pro bono mediator to bring us to a point of being able to bless each other going forward. It specifies that the prohibitive language in our Book of Discipline, language that restricts the full participation of LGBTQ persons in the life of the church, would be removed. The protocol would not require any church or annual conference to take any votes unless they want to leave the UMC.

There has been much uncertainty over the past 10 month since the traditional plan was passed last February in St. Louis. There is reason to hope that that uncertainty might now ease or end all together. This plan still needs to be ratified by nearly 900 delegates who will meet in May, 2020 in Minneapolis. So, a decision will not be made until then.

We are standing at a crossroads of a new reality, so let us be in prayer for our United Methodist Church and for Our Redeemerøs UMC in the days ahead. Let us continue to stay focused on doing the work of Jesus Christ in our world. There will be discussions around the NIC about what is expected to take place at the General Conference in May. The discussion nearest to ORUMC is scheduled for **Thursday, Feb. 13 from 7-9pm at Our Saviour's** just down the road. These discussions are co-hosted by the NIC Exploration Team and NIC General/Jurisdictional Delegation.

Fall Stewardship Campaign Good News/Bad News

Good News:

Our Capital pledges put us in the best position in a long time. We have Capital Fund commitments for 2020 totaling \$52,290.

That, along with the fact that our mortgage balance is less than \$4000, means we can pay it off by Easter.

However, the Capital Fund cannot be used to meet Operating Expenses.

Last year we were able to meet our expenses and our Apportionment to the Northern Illinois Conference.

In addition, we will be recognized as a Rainbow Covenant church because we were able to go the extra mile through contributions to Rainbow missions.

Rainbow Covenant missions include UMCOR Disaster Relief, Prison Release Ministry and other missions Our Redeemers has long supported.

Troubling News:

Pledged income for the General Operating Fund is below the last two years by 15%.

For 2020, pledge commitments to General Operations are \$240,000. In 2018 and 2019, pledges were \$282,000 and \$272,000, respectively.

Without additional financial pledges and donations for the Operating Fund, we will need to use our Reserve Funds.

Our reserves have been stable and not needed for more than 10 years.

If you have not made a Financial Pledge commitment for 2020, please prayerfully consider making it now.

If your 2020 Pledge was only to the Capital Fund, please consider moving some to the General Operating Fund where it is needed more.

Finally, if you have made a 2020 pledge towards the General Operating Fund already and have found that you have or will receive an unexpected company bonus, tax refund, or other additional income in 2020 we ask that you consider increasing your familyøs earlier pledge.

Thank you very much to all who pledged to Our Redeemers for 2020, in Prayer, Presence, Gifts and Service.

Because of you, we can continue with our vital ministries.




Thanks to all who worked to make the Trivia Night a fun time. We had good food, good fellowship, a good time and didnøt win a thing.
