

My dear Friends in Christ,

A new year has arrived and now that advent calendars, manger scenes and decorations are packed away in the garage till next year, our brother John Wesley comes to challenge us to begin this new year by renewing our covenant with God, in the same manner that he strongly urged his followers to renew their covenant with their Creator. Following in the steps of our Wesleyan tradition, I invite you to join us as we renew our Covenant with God and our baptism using John Wesleyøs historic Covenant Renewal Service, which will be held on the first Sunday in January.

Wesleyøs Covenant service was held for the first time on August 11, 1755 at Spitalfields in London, with an outstanding attendance of 1800 people. In our area, the first covenant service in Chicago was celebrated at Ft. Dearborn on New Yearøs Eve, 1831, by the congregation of First United Methodist Episcopal Church, worshipping then on Wolf Point. The heart of the service celebrated that night, focused on the Covenant Prayer. This same Liturgy will be used in our Covenant Service. John Wesley introduced this covenant service as an important part of spiritual life in the Methodist Societies. This renewal service was a time for the Methodists to gather annually in a time of selfexamination, reflection, and dedication, wholly giving up themselves and renewing covenant with God.

This idea of Covenant was basic to John Wesleyøs understanding of Christian discipleship. He saw the relationship with God in Covenant as being like a marriage between human beings on the one side and God in (cont on pg 2)

Christ on the other (Ephesians 5: 21-33). It is important to emphasize that the Covenant is not a contract in which God and human beings agree to provide particular goods and services for each other! It is not something that we have to do to create a relationship with God as God has freely already made it possible. Rather, the Covenant is the means of grace by which we accept the relationship that God has given to you and I and then seek to sustain it. It is not so much about you and I getting into a relationship with God as it is about staying in it. The covenant is about liv-

I'm Not Racist! Or Am I?

What is racism?

Is racism unavoidable?

What is white privilege?

How do I know if I'm racist?

Can I be racist even if I treat everyone equally?

Can I be racist if I have friends of color?

Can legislation change racism?

Is racism easy to identify?

The Shepherding team for the Northern Illinois Conference of the United Methodist Church has set three goals for all churches. Goal #2 statesöTo live out the conviction that racism is incompatible with Christian teaching.ö In order to do that, with all that is happening in our world, perhaps we all need to take a deeper look at ourselves.

In Biblical terms, racism is a demon and an idol, a fallen principality and power that enslaves people and nations in its deadly grip. A power according to the Bible (and racism is virtually emblematic in this regard) may be identified as both structural and spiritual - having two aspects in these realities. Walter Wink, teacher of non-Christian violence explained that the creation hymn to Colossians 1:15-20 underlines powers and authorities and describe them as both heavenly and earthly, visible and invisible. Every power tends to have a visible pole, an outer formô be it a church, a nation, or an economyô and an invisible pole, an inner spirit or driving force that animates. According to the Bible, racism is not just a structural and economic problem, but also a spiritual one, something that requires both prayer and action.

Our church is offering all of us the opportunity to look a little deeper at ourselves. Beginning in January, we are invited to join a **six weeks** Zoom study of the book <u>White Fragility</u> by Robin Diangelo. The book starts with the premise that racism exists and explores how one aspect of white sensibility continues to hold racism in place. And that is <u>white</u> <u>fragility</u>. And because of white fragility, it is rare that at any time in our lives we actually discuss racism.

Two sessions are being offered via Zoom and facilitated by Pastor Shirley.

For the first session we will read and discuss the authorøs note, the introduction, and chapter 1.
