Update on PADS (Public Action to Deliver Shelter)

PADS has taken a very different turn this winter due to COVID. For many years, various churches have opened their doors, usually one night a week during the winter, to offer shelter to the homeless. There have been no sites open for obvious reasons. However, that does not mean guests have not been taken care of.

Journeys the Road Home is the parent organization for PADS. It is a non-profit agency that provides shelter, social services and housing to the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless in 37 towns in north/northwest suburban Cook County. They have thankfully been able to pay for hotel rooms for guests this whole season. Volunteers have been able to donate meals, but in a different manner. At this point, all slots for these donations have been filled.

They do have a need for small denomination (\$5, \$10) gift cards to grocery or drug stores, or places such as Subway. If you would like to contribute to this, please drop off your gift cards to the church office, or when you are at church for communion.

Of course monetary donations are also greatly appreciated. They can be mailed to Journeys the Road Home, 1140 E Northwest Hwy, Palatine, IL 60074.

Thank you for any support you are able to offer to this important local mission. I will let you know when service opportunities are again available, most likely next winter.

Our Youth were busy this month raising money for both our ASP mission trip in June 2021 and for World Vision through our 30 Hour Famine event that was held February 26-27, 2021. We had 11 young people participate in Famine, including Allison Walters who joined us from College via Zoom and FaceTime. The focus of Famine this year was "Manna Fest" in which we explored the concept of God providing for our needs through 'manna' through the lens of food, water, health, play, education, safety and faith.

Famine was facilitated in a 'hybrid' approach with a combination of Zoom lessons and reflections, games and challenges in teams in different family homes, a mission grocery challenge, winter games in the church parking lot, and a closing circle in which we broke our fast with communion. And as the it says in scripture: "Then the Lord said to Moses, õI will rain down bread from heaven for you. ...ö -- Exodus 16:4 (NIV) And, indeed, the Lord provided 'manna' in the form of 12 individual loaves made by Donna Echtner - one for each family - and individual grape juice packs!

Dear Our Redeemer's Church Family,

It has been a long winter, but hope is beginning to spring eternal as we have had a break in the weather and we are beginning to draw our attention to Easter Sunday and the celebration of our Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!!

The ReTurn team has continued to monitor the ups and downs of the Covid-19 pandemic through the past few months. In consultation with the Worship team, we are planning for an Easter Sunday Parking Lot Service on Sunday April 4 at 10:00 a.m. We are also repurposing some rooms to accommodate church groups that wish to meet within our building.

The start of the availability of Covid-19 vaccinations for some people has been a positive note in our fight against Covid-19. However, 500,000+ deaths to this terrible virus have also been a sad milestone. As we continue to follow all safety guidelines, here are some things that we will begin to implement starting on Easter Sunday

1. 10:00 a.m. Parking Lot Services will be scheduled on a weekly basis. These services will also be streamed for members to watch at home. Rain or severe weather or technical problems will be the <u>only</u> reasons that we will not meet outside during the warm weather season. In the event of inclement weather, we will move the parking lot service indoors and will have to limit the number of persons according to the state guidelines of 40 attendees. Meeting outside is the safest

way, at the present, that all of us can come together as the Body of Christ for worship. Accommodating a larger group in the parking lot will also allow us to welcome visitors and walk-ins to our services. This is what we have been missing. What a celebration we will have!!

- 2. In April, a sign up, via phone or online for a limited number of people to attend in building services will start. This sign up will only be implemented when we have inclement weather and canot celebrate with the whole congregation together outside. We will continue to stream our services for people to view at home.
- 3. In April, a video of guidelines for inbuilding worship will be released to the congregation. Training for ushers will take place on Sunday, April 11 at 2:00 p.m. via zoom in anticipation of times of inclement weather when 40 people will still be able to attend services inside the building per the CDC safety guidelines.
- 4. For most groups in our church, Zoom meetings have been very successful. If your group is meeting on Zoom, we highly encourage you to continue to do so. However, for those groups who need to use the building for church meetings we are opening up WESLEY HALL. There will be a training meeting for safety protocol on Sunday, March 21 at 2:00p.m. via Zoom. An active member of each group wishing to meet in the building must attend, train the other members of their group and follow through with any

required paperwork. Meetings must be scheduled each time through the church office. One person may represent more than one group.

5. In ASBURY HALL, sections will be set aside for our Sunday School and Youth programs. This will allow us the opportunity to meet the safety requirements of increased spacing and increased ventilation.

Everyone is praying for the health of our members, our church, our country and our world. We pray all people have speedy and fair access to vaccinations and that the Covid-19 virus will continue to decline. As we move through this calendar year, may we make even more headway to return to our onew normalo. We will soon be united in the Body of Christ in person and what a celebration that will be!
