

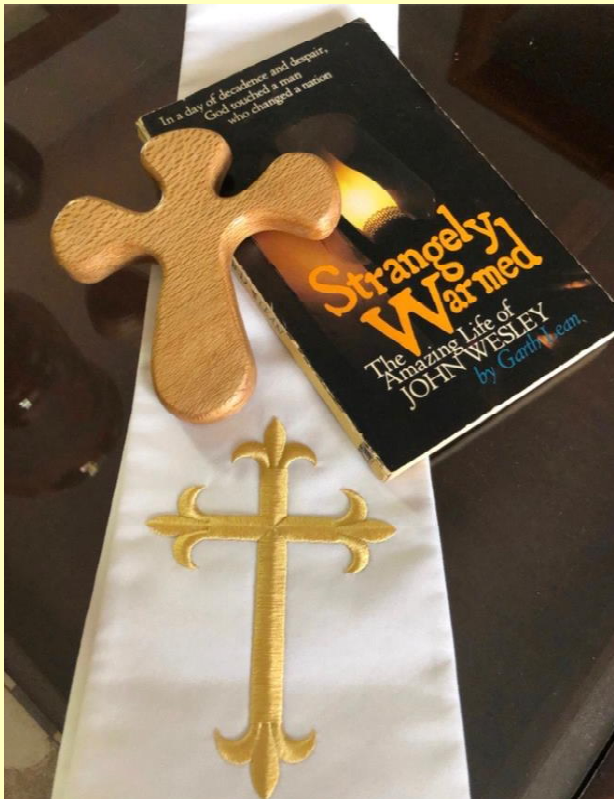
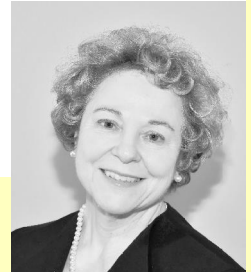

Aldersgate Day

May 24, 1738

"In the evening I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Martin Luther's preface to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death." John Wesley



Dear Friends in Christ,

In the month of May we celebrate John Wesley's Aldersgate experience. Aldersgate is quite a name in our Methodist tradition. Have you ever been to Aldersgate? In the Summer of 1996 I was able to attend Aldersgate United Methodist Church in Augusta, GA. This congregation began on September 9, 1962, when ten families joined together and took a great step of faith in organizing a new Methodist church. By the time I visited this place, the church had grown to several hundred members and was a strong, working body of believers.

I have also been to Aldersgate Street in London, England. On the site of where John Wesley had his life-changing moment there is a bronze memorial Methodist Flame and plaque commemorating his experience on May 24, 1738. What happened to Wesley on Wednesday, May 24, 1738 would forever change his life and forever change the world. According to his journal, he was heavy-hearted when he went over very unwillingly to an evening meeting on Aldersgate Street. Aldersgate experience was crucial for his own life and became a touchstone for the Wesleyan movement.

While someone was reading from Martin Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Ro-

mans, that night, Wesley felt that his heart was ðstrangely warmed.ö He describes it as: ðI felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation; and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.ö

I have been to Aldersgate. However the ðAldersgate experienceö can be had at any place and at any time. The place is not important, neither our age or life circumstances.

The deep sense that God's grace is adequate for me is important. The assurance that God has forgiven me is perhaps the most significant truth that I can imagine. One historian said that at Aldersgate Wesley's ðintellectual conviction was turned into a personal experience.ö

It was a turning point in his spiritual growth. Faith in Jesus Christ became real for him. May 23th is Aldersgate Sunday in the United Methodist Church and also Pentecost Sunday for the whole Christian World.

We will have a worship celebration in the parking lot at 10:00 a.m. and pray that you will be able to join us.

It is my hope and prayer that you will experience your ðheart strangely warmedö and you will know the assurance of God's love and forgiveness, this Sunday and every moment of your life.

Every Sunday Through Warm Weather is a Parking Lot Service at 10:00am Except for Inclement Weather

Call the ORUMC HOTLINE: 1-847-238-2181 to hear a status message on whether the worship service will be conducted outside in the parking lot or inside the sanctuary. A message will be posted no later than 6 p.m. on Saturday evenings. Last minute decisions will be announced no later than 8:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings, if the weather significantly changes overnight. If weather does move the service inside, we are limited to 50 people total in the sanctuary including the worship team and support staff. AND reservations must be made to guarantee that we do not exceed the 50-person limit.

We will continue all of our Covid-19 safety precautions. Our number 1 priority is the love and care we have for one another. Each of us may have different health concerns and sensitivities that others may not be aware of.

To be considerate to every person so that as many people can attend our services and participate in our activities as possible we are called by our love and concern for each other to wear a mask and maintain 6-foot social distance during the entire time we are together. Please respect others' privacy and don't ask others if it is OK to hug them. These actions enable us to worship God in a community of Christ and to invite others to join us.

Troubleshooting Tips - LiveStream Services:

The best time to log into YouTube is five to three minutes before the start of the broadcast. If you log in too early, the page will not show the "featured" video yet. If that happens, it is best to close the browser and open it again to reload the page data. Our WTTF

Tech Team has a "Welcome Message" that lets you know that we are about to start. Many thanks to the ReTurn Team, Worship Team, and the WTTF Technology Team for pulling together this opportunity to "test out" the parameters necessary for us to worship safely in unity as one body of Christ, the ORUMC family, together!

In Person Worship Service Registration

In the event of inclement weather, registration is required to attend the INSIDE worship service in the Sanctuary (50-person limit) or Wesley Hall (20-person limit).

Call the ORUMC HOTLINE: 847-238-2181 after 6 p.m. on Saturday evenings (or Sunday morning if there is a significant unexpected change in the weather) to confirm if we will hold the Worship Service OUTSIDE in the Parking Lot or INSIDE the Sanctuary.

You can call the office 847-882-6116 Monday - Friday during office hours to make a reservation.

If you have computer access, and you can access the Realm system remotely, then you can make your reservations via Realm. Email will be sent out weekly with a link to give access to the the Realm registration function for the coming Sunday.

To register for inside service, click on the link and register by name - yourself, family and friends - as either Worship Participants (Sanctuary), Worship Participants (Wesley Hall) or Worship Team Leaders.

Look in your email for confirmation of registration.

If you cannot access Realm, you can send a reservation via email to ORUMChurch@gmail.com.

Contact Pastor Nancy if assistance is needed at 773-350-8508 or revnancygrimhunter@gmail.com. If you unable to attend, please cancel your registration so that others on the waiting list may attend. You can also "attend" by sitting in your car and listening to the FM 104.5 radio broadcast or watching the LiveStream service on our ORUMC YouTube channel.

Troubleshooting Tips - Inside Worship Services:

Those with Yahoo email addresses will not be able to access the Realm software system to register. The Realm server is detecting security breaches in Yahoo accounts and is blocking them completely.

Individuals with Yahoo accounts should consider using a different email address to register (such as Gmail, Ymail, ATT, etc.) Contact Pastor Nancy for assistance.

Be patient in clicking the "Confirm Registration" button. The "decision click" has to travel to the server on another computer far away and send back a "confirmation message" to your computer. A majority of error messages received in the pilot were because people clicked too fast and too often.

Consider registering with Realm Connect

to be able to view the church online directory and future registration events. On the Featured Registration Events page you will be able to save a permanent bookmark link. Go to [<https://onrealm.org/OurRedeemersUni/>] and follow the steps to register your member account. Once registered ó save the following Bookmark Link: [<https://onrealm.org/OurRedeemersUni/Registrations/UpcomingEvents>]

Write down your Realm Connect password in a safe location in case you need to validate your identity.

Refresh your email server before registration. Some reported errors were related to personal computer validation protocols which are totally separate from the REALM Registration process. If need be, reach out to Pastor Nancy to help you optimize your settings to avoid glitches.

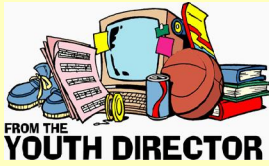

Invitation to the Lord's Table

Principle:

The invitation to the Table comes from the risen and present Christ. Christ invites to his Table those who love him, repent of sin, and seek to live as Christian disciples. Holy Communion is a gift of God to the church and an act of the community of faith. By responding to this invitation we affirm and deepen our personal relationship with God through Jesus Christ and our commitment to membership and mission in the body of Christ.

Background:

The Invitation to Holy Communion in our united Methodist Hymnal ðA Service of Word and Table Ið and ðA Service of Word and Table IIð proclaims, ðChrist our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one anotherð (UMH; pages 7, 12). The more traditional wording in ðA Service of Word and Table IVð invites, ðYe that do truly and earnestly repent of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbors, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in his holy ways: Draw near with faith . . . ð (UMH; page 26). ðA Service of Word and Table V,ð for use with people who are sick or homebound, says that Christ in-

vites ðall who love him and seek to grow into his likenessð (BOW; page 51).

Practice:

When Holy Communion is celebrated, it is important to always begin with the words of Invitation, including Confession and Pardon. If these are omitted, all those present may not understand either the openness of the Table of the Lord or the expectation of repentance, forgiveness, healing, and entrance into new life in Christ.

The church community has a responsibility to provide ongoing age-appropriate nurture and education about the sacrament of Holy Communion to all its people. Those who are baptized as infants need continual teaching as they mature in faith. Those who come into membership later in life also need ongoing instruction about the significance of the sacrament in their personal faith journey and in the life of the congregation and larger Christian community. All who seek to live as Christian disciples need formation in sacramental spirituality.

Bishops, elders, deacons, pastors, Sunday school teachers, parents and guardians, seminary professors, and others have responsibility for faithfully teaching understandings and practices of Holy Communion. Teaching about the sacraments should emphasize United Methodist positions and practices but should also encourage knowledge of and respect for those of other Christian traditions.

The Issue of "Unworthiness"

Principle:

Any person who answers in faith the invitation "Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one another" (UMH; page 7) is worthy through Christ to partake of Holy Communion. Christians come to the Lord's Table in gratitude for Christ's mercy toward sinners. We do not share in Communion because of our worthiness; no one is truly worthy. We come to the Eucharist out of our hunger to receive God's gracious love, to receive forgiveness and healing.

Background:

Some deeply committed United Methodist people who hesitate or even refuse to partake of Holy Communion do so because of their sense that they are unworthy. This problem is largely based upon misinterpretation and false fears. Within the United Methodist tradition, people who participate in the sacrament are assured of the forgiveness of their sins and of pardon through their participation in the Invitation and the Confession and Pardon.

Paul's words of warning in 1 Corinthians 11:27-32 have long been a source of confusion and concern. Some people are fearful of communing "in an unworthy manner" and, sometimes out of genuine Christian humility, believe that their participation would be improper. John Wesley addressed this problem in his sermon "The Duty of Constant Communion": "God offers you one of the greatest

mercies on this side heaven, and commands you to accept it. . . . You are unworthy to receive any mercy from God. But is that a reason for refusing all mercy? . . . Why do you not obey God's command? . . . What! unworthy to obey God?" (II.7-8)

Wesley went on to explain that unworthiness does not apply to the people who are to commune, but to the manner in which the consecrated elements are consumed: "Here is not a word said of being unworthy to eat and drink. Indeed he [Paul] does speak of eating and drinking unworthily; but that is quite a different thing. . . . In this very chapter we are told that by eating and drinking unworthily is meant, taking the holy Sacrament in such a rude and disorderly way, that one was "hungry, and another drunken" [1 Cor. 11:21] (II.9).

First Corinthians 11:29 is a word of judgment against "all who eat and drink without discerning the body." A footnote to this passage in *The New Oxford Annotated Bible* (NRSV) explains that this is a reference to "the community, one's relation to other Christians" (page 242). Paul is speaking against those who fail to recognize the church "the body of Christ" as a community of faith within which Christians relate to each other in love.

Practice:

If you are having feelings of unworthiness, contact the pastor. Through patient counseling, faithful teaching, and prayers for healing we can help you alleviate most of these concerns.

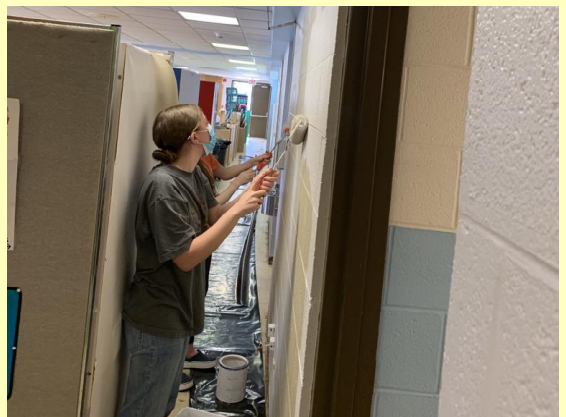
