May is an important month for the Methodist family. May 24th is as close as you get to a holy day in Methodism, because May 24th, 1738 was the day on which John Wesley& heart was ostrangely warmed.ö In his journal he tells that he felt God& presence and heard His voice and discover the deepest meaning of his life. old felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation: and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and deatho.

I believe that there is not a single person to whom God has not spoken, some way, somehow, about where Godøs wants their children to go, or in your personal case, what God wants you to do in the next chapter of your life.

The question is whether or not you and I are listening to the ups and the downs in our lives, listening to the people around us who believe in us, listening to the surprise developments that come, truly, out of nowhere, situations where Godøs is speaking to us.

I think about the disciples of Jesus and how they were each going about their own business and then came the voice, õFollow me.ö No command to go home and figure out your life plan. Just õFollow me.ö And gladly they responded. And, in doing so, they discovered the deepest gladness and meaning they had ever known.

God speaks if we will listen. Sometimes with a gentle word of direction. Sometimes through the voice of someone else preaching the Word of God as it happened to Wesley.

Sometimes using the tactic of an ambush, as in Moses.

õMoses, Moses!ö the Lord called out to the young man. Moses was so taken aback he answered as a school boy might: õHere!ö

õDonøt come any closer,ö the Lord warned from that burning bush. õTake your sandals off. Where youøre standing is holy ground.ö

You do not have to be standing on the rim of the Grand Canyon at sunset, see a burning bush or listening to a preacher in London. You just have to keep your eyes and ears open where you are.

God made sure that John Wesley, Moses, the disciples understood that the voice they were hearing was the voice of the God who had guided their ancestors forever. And after he had established that ancestry,

God got down to business, because clearly God was interested in more than their individual destinies. The fate of desperate, suffering people was on Godøs mind.

When we finally listened to His call, push through the wall of our own self-doubt and sense of inadequacy we begin the journey. God knew John Wesley, Moses, the disciples would be fine. The problem was they didnot know it.

God intended to give them everything he would need to fulfill His mission. The challenge was in helping them get to the place where they could trust God to work in, through, and around their human limitations.

These stories remind us that the God who calls also equips. Donøt worry about it. The risk lies in whether we will allow our sense of inadequacy, our tendency to tread water where we are, whether we let those things hold us back. Jesus showed us a better way to live.

Dear friends, if your only goal in life is to get your needs met or have your ducks in order before you are open to hear the voice of God, then I will guarantee that you will miss out on the life God intends for you.

The purpose of human life has always been about being a part of that which is larger and more enduring than one self.

The life you're living now-it is the only one you've got. Don't spend it being scared, not being ready, not being what you should be. ÕAre not two sparrows sold for a penny?

Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all countedö. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.

It is my prayer that you, my friend, will be open to hear His voice and see His holy majesty at work in your life.
