Dear Friends in Christ.

I always wonder what it might have looked like on a given day around 30 A.D. had there been at that time some equivalent of a present day news website. Along the top banner of the page would be the "Breaking News" of the moment.

Perhaps on one particular day it would read "Zealots Attack Roman Forces: Troops Obliterate Zealots." Below that would be a picture of King Herod receiving a delegation from Rome in his imperial throne room. Off to the right side would be a list of the day's "Hot Topics," that might have included news bulletins from Rome, from Asia Minor, and other important areas of that time. Then would come the "Top Stories" for the day that might have included some political plots involving Pontius Pilate; a story involving the powerful leaders coming up with new policy initiatives, levying their taxes, trying to keep Rome from going over one fiscal cliff or another; and a report on the doings of some of the more famous and beautiful people of the Roman Empire, maybe a report of the royal engagement between one of King Herod's son and a Siro-Phoenician Princess.
