## Dear Friends in Christ,

As is our tradition here at ORUMC, early in the New Year, usually the first Sunday of the year, we meet to renew our covenant with our Creator. This is a Methodist practice which can be traced back to the first covenant service held by John Wesley in 1755, this was a moment of solemn reflection and rededication to be in a relationship with God and one another. These were times of great



spiritual blessing and fellowship in love as Wesley writes in his Journal. On Sunday 1st January 1775 Wesley wrote:

õWe had a larger congregation at the renewal of the Covenant than we have had for many years; and I do not know that ever we had a greater blessing. Afterwards many desired to return thanks, either for a sense of pardon, for full salvation, or for a fresh manifestation of his grace, healing all their backslidings.ö

It is interesting to me that the reason people remain part of a Christian congregation is because of the quality of love that they experience in human relationships. People often join a church because of a fine choir, fine Bible studies, fine programs; but people never remain in a congregation for these reasons. (cont on pg 2)


