Dear Friends in Christ.

I can not believe it is February already. It seems that the first month of 2024 passed by in no time at all. So ... How are you doing with your 2024 goals? Do you remember that moment when you thought of writing down some goals for this year? I don't know about you but on the moment in which I write goals or make a resolution of any kind, there is almost always an acknowledgment that the living of the resolution will be harder than the making of it, and that I will not be faithful to those goals, if I rely only on my willpower, good intentions and strength. you to journey on the path to which you have been called by God, and all their very twists and turns. I wonder if you might recall a time, perhaps you are in such a time now, when you seriously questioned whether you could stay on a given path, in part because it was nothing like what you would hoped or expected.

From Genesis to revelation. there are these moments upon which the arc of salvation rests. There is the exodus. God's liberation of the people from the bond in Egypt and the covenant God made with them in the wilderness and then follow the stories, story after story, of the people's failure to live up to their side of the covenant. All the times that they repent, they receive forgiveness and restoration again, repent again, restored again, and so on. More than once, we get the message, loud and clear, that God is disappointed with the Israelites and by extension, with us. But, what about the people? They were disappointed, too. This relationship with God was not what they had imagine, God did not conform to their expectations.

And they were not the people they had imagine themselves to be and that they wanted to be. So, they had to learn through a long process of transformation, that they were being formed into the people God was calling them to be. It was in exile that the people of Israel learned that God does not abandon, despite sin and failing, which is a word for us to hang onto, whenever we feel in a place of exile ourselves, that we are not alone as Jesus followers. We can hold onto his words, that He will be with us to the end of the age. As the people in the Bible, our lives are marked by moments of hope and resolve, followed by messiness, the messiness of life and disappointment with other people, family members, and the institutions in which we work. and God knows, ourselves. But, what I dare to believe, and I dare say you do, too, the times of disorientation, disappointment and failure are as much part of the path to which we have been called as to the more joyful, clear ones, when we confidently said yes to our Savior and open our eyes to see His light guiding our path.

It is my prayer, my dear friends, that you pray for that guiding light to illumine your path every morning. That light that gives us reassurance, that when it feels as if we have lost our way and we can not see the path ahead of us as the road gets dark, as it sometimes does, the light never fades, we just need to open our eyes to see and trust.

May His light guide you in the living of your promises,





Spaghetti is served after church until 1pm. A donation is requested, but not necessary.


