Happy New Year dear ORUMC!

I give thanks to God for you, for your love of service in the name of Christ and as we begin this new year together, I would like to offer few words reflecting on questions of faith that come to me, and I am sure, to you as well. Especially, during this time of the year.

As I look for guidance and clarity at the beginning of a new year, season or a new project in my life, I often wonder if I truly hear God's voice, when I ask for His guidance or if it is my own imagination, telling me which way to go. I pray that God will help me hear His voice and understand His word, but I'm afraid that I get distracted and sometimes, more often than not, I am overwhelmed and I may not hear Him. "How do I know that I am going in the direction God is showing me?" I ask myself, continuously. This is a good question for all of us to ponder, particularly in this season in the Cristian year.

This Sunday is the first one in the season known as EPIPHANY. A word you may recall means *revelation*. To have an epiphany is like the proverbial lightbulb going off in your head. This question is a longing for that moment of clarity with which to take the next step... an epiphany. As my father used to teach my brothers and I when we were teenagers, "an epiphany is anything that comes to us from the outside that resonates deeply with us on the inside. There's a part of us that's always listening for that connection." It is what the great black theologian Howard Thurman called, "the sound of the genuine". *Sound of the Genuine* is one of his last speeches of his life, back in 1980, at commencement for the graduates of Spellman college. He said the

following: "there's something in each one of you that waits, listens for the sound of the genuine in yourself, and if you cannot hear it, you will never find whatever it is that you are searching for. And if you hear it, and do not follow it, it would be better that you had never been born, because you are the only one" he said, "that has ever lived. You are the only YOU, that has ever lived. Your idiom is the only idiom of its kind in all existence, and if you cannot hear the sound of the genuine in you, you will, all your life, spend your days on the end of strings that somebody else pulls".

For those of us who want to follow God now, to hear the voice of Jesus now, for those who really want to hear and respond to the sound of that genuine call, there's no escaping the need for us to cultivate the inner practices of reflection prayer and meditation. These inner practices, first, help us to listen for whatever God might be saying. And then, equally important, is to ponder and reflect upon what we think we are hearing. To test our perceptions. Then, over time to get ready for what we sense what's being asked of us. The disciples, before they dropped everything to follow Jesus, they had spent time around him and they had been in each other's company.

eating, conversing, sharing and praying and together looking for discernment in their lives.

If, during this new year, you will be moving through times of uncertainty and decision-making, I encourage you, at the end of every day, simply to take a few moments and ask yourself two questions: What happened today for which I'm most grateful for... what's the thing that I will give thanks for as I lay my head down tonight? And, what's the thing I'm not so grateful for? You can ask these questions in million different ways... what made me feel alive today? Where did I feel life draining out of me? and this is not something that you do one day, but overtime. The practice is helpful.

So, I invite you to set yourself a period of time when you just chart what gives you life, what gives you joy, where do you find energy, what sucks energy out of you? This practice might be a clue as to where God would be pleased for your life to go. Howard Thurman said again in another speech: "don't ask yourself what the world needs. Ask what makes you come most alive, because what the world most needs are people who are alive, alive with a sense of joy and purpose."

Let me leave you with a word of encouragement. Should any of you

be in an area of your life, that needs this kind of discerning and listening, and waiting for the sound of the genuine, pray and trust your own unique ways of listening and pondering. Whatever it is that helps you make the connection between what you're hearing from the outside, and what resonates deep within you. If it is a big decision you are wrestling with, consider taking some time to ponder and then seek out the wisdom people in your life. Remember the church friends who have provided you with holy guidance in the past. And, should you be that person for another, ask in prayer to God for His discernment to be with you as you help others.

Please, know that I am praying for you, as you listen for His voice, and the "sound of the genuine" in your own heart this year 2024. My prayer is that you be given sufficient clarity and be encouraged to respond.

May God bless you with clarity and discernment this new year, Pastor Shirley

PRAIRIE CENTRAL DISTRICT SPRING LAY ACADEMY 2-5 PM,


First 5 Sundays of Lent— February 18, 25, March 3,10,17 Plainfield UMC, Plainfield, Illinois
